Girinka or One milky cow per poor family is one of the country leading initiative in both tackling the issues of malnutrition which causing stunting in children under five years in Rwanda, and response to lack of industrial fertilizers since cows produces manure, reducing poverty through dairy cattle farming and improving livelihoods through increased milk consumption and income generation.

FMO has been supporting the government in this program by providing good cows breeds to families in need in three sectors of Bugesera District (Rilima, Nyarugenge and Shyara).

The cows are either pregnant or directly inseminated before handed to the beneficiary to be hosted in well

To circumvent the issue of high density of population and insufficient cultivable land, goats rearing have been found as a very profitable livestock as alternative to cows.

Since 2014, FMO implements the Three goats program to make sure families without cultivable land are part of the development journey in the community. Each family is provided of 3 female goats and required to give back three kids to the next neighbor on the beneficiary list provided by the local authority.

The beneficiaries of the cows also received three goats to accompany the cow since this last one take long to reproduce, so that meanwhile the beneficiary can have potential source of income to prevent he/she sells the cow.

So far, this has been the most successful program as it serves as a guick source of

This project contributed significantly to overall income generated by these families. 1426 goats distributed to 473 families in Rilima, Nyarugenge and Shyara Sectors

Selected small business projects are funded in a range of 50,000 to 3,000.,000 RWF. Since 2013, the fund has been expended from



MICROCREDIT LOANS





Bugesera being a semi-arid area with frequent drought and long sunny season, alternative to continue farming is to pump water from its lakes to uphill with cultivable lands. Individual people with enough lands or grouped people with small lands were put together to benefit from diesel pump and its accessories in partial funding to be repaid through the microcredit fund. This year 1 & 4 irrigation projects in Rilima & Shyara respectively were funded, total 11 irrigation projects realized and beneficiaries trained IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT FUNDING





CHILD PROTECTION PROGRAM



In order to protect children under 6 years, an Early childhood Development center was constructed and equipped to ensure the delivery of 5 ECD services to 120 kids of Kimaranzara Cell in Rilima sector, Bugesera District . The center has three programs : Community based ECD center: in which 90 kids benefits with 5 compments of ECD i.e Education, Nutrition, Security &Safety, Hygiene&Sanitation and Health.

Home based&Home Visitation program: 467 children and their parents have been reached at selected bamos in their respective villages with putritive feed

CHILD PROTECTION PROGRAM



Two more classrooms for Early Childhood Development for Kalilisi Community have been rehabilitated and equipment to host 70 kids of Kabeza Cell in Rilima sector, Bugesera District. This program aims at reducing the number of children who can not attend pre-primary and exposed to different risks in the community while their parents are in the fields cultivating. The centre is equipped with recreational and stimulating facilities.





Malnutrition and Stunting prevention



- In a continuous effort to prevent and eradicate malnutrition in children under five years, Growth measurements for 1,412 children from food insecure families have been monitored regularly through 15 village kitchen in three sectors to ensure they don't fall in stunting category.
- 374 children presented symptoms of malnutrition and stunting have been treated and provided with weekly fortified food package, eggs, and milk.
- Their Parents have been Trained on preparing balance diet, positive
- For sustainable solution of malnutrition problem, a poultry project was initiated with 300 laying chickens for which eggs will be distributed to malnourished kids or children from food insecure families.comtoso

Houses construction for vulnerable families




- 26 families houses are being built in Nyarungene Houses
