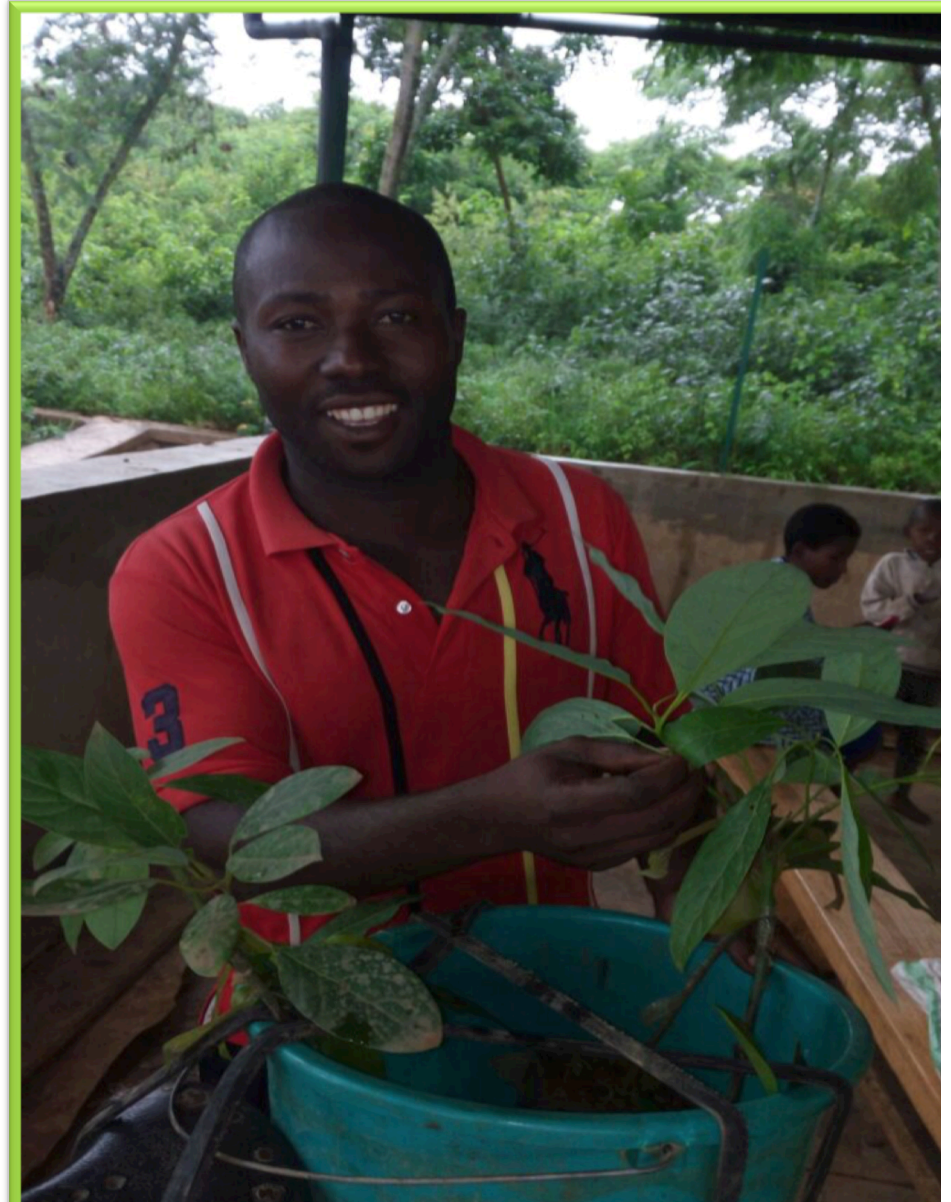

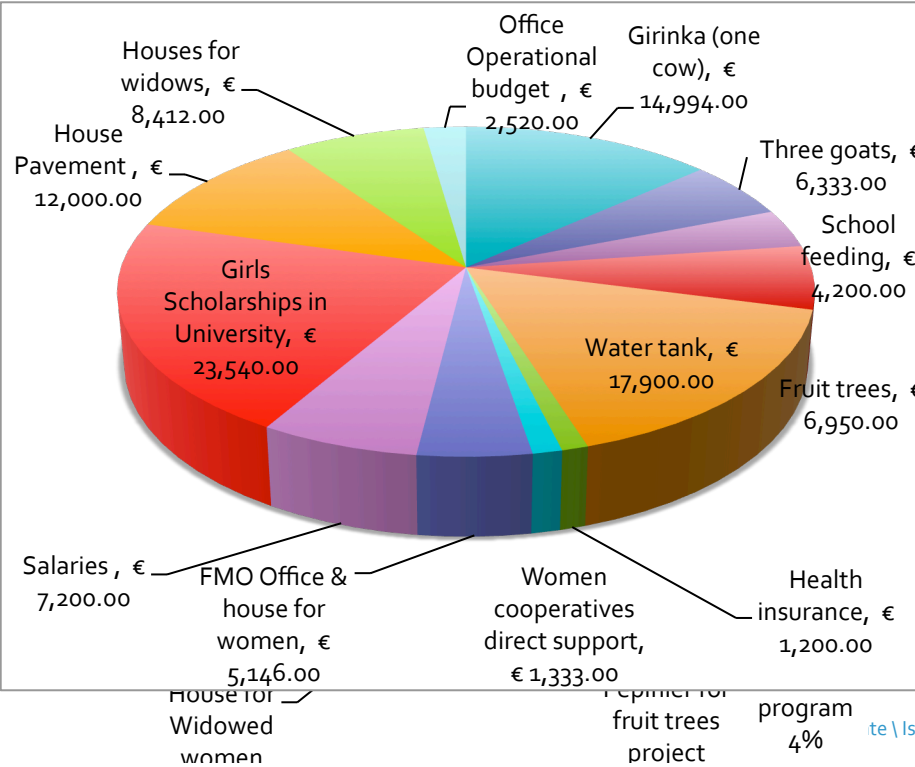

Introduction

Since 2013, Fondazione Marcegaglia Onlus is a development partner for Bugesera District, with main goal; to increasing the economic status of less privileged women.

The objectives of the project are the following:

- 1). Rwanda Government and Fondazione Marcegaglia agree that the overall goals of the "One Cow" is to address the fundamenta needs of those families that are critically food insecure;
- 2). Assist the Rwandan women in 1st and 2nd Ubudehe category to enhance living conditions for their families through practice of modern livestock, farming, small enterprises, and cooperatives.
- 3). Support Rwanda as it is becoming the showcase for societal transformation by realizing most of Millennium Development Goals, through a successful implementation of EDPRS (Economic Development and Poverty Reduction Strategy) towards 2020 vision.

SUMMARY OF PROJECTS



Girinka (One Cow Project)

This year, additional 10 cows has been given out to make total 48 cows as of May 2017 to deserving families in Rilima Sector. Along with the cows houses built and water tanks are built to house and feed the cows. Cows are a valuable asset to families because they provide income through their milk, their manure is a good fertilizer for gardens, and later on, them or their calves can be sold.



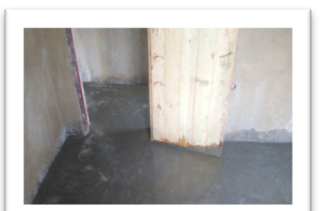
Three Goats Project

54 families have received 172 goats this year, which brings the total 5,565 goats given to 185 families in last three years. Goats are valuable because they reproduce quickly and provide income for families. Families are encouraged to participate in what is known as "kuzitura," a donation of one of the kids their goat has given birth to in order to benefit another family in need.



Rain Water Harvest and Water infrastructure

The second community water reservoir has been built to ensure the close source of water as a necessity for the village of Rilima. These two water tanks each of 60,00 liter plastic water tanks adds to 10 plastic water tanks each of 5000 litters provided to individual families benefited from Girinka Program



Sanitation

62 houses have been paved in collaboration with Tubeheza Company to ensure dust free homes. This came as a sustainable solution to reduce poor hygiene related diseases, especially for children less than 5 years.

SUMMARY OF PROJECTS (CONT.)



House for Widowed Women

As response to other urgent community needs, 4 houses in total have been built to most vulnerable families. The construction was part of a community wide effort and used funds saved from other projects.



Support for Women's Cooperative

Monetary capital support of One million RWF has been given to two women's cooperatives in the Rilima Sector. One focuses creating plastic bags, mushrooms farming and envisioning in poultry business. While another produces the historic "Imigongo" paintings to sell around the world, pineapple plantation as well as creating a communal savings fund.



School Feeding Program

50 students from food insecure families were given school lunches throughout 2015- 2016 academic year. This is a short-term solution to support families while the other projects they benefit from pay off.



Fruit Trees

Currently there are 16,000 fruit seedlings that are waiting to be distributed to the families in Rilima. Each family will receive three seedlings to help fill their need for more fresh fruits and vegetables. The garden currently employs two women while the plants are ready to be distributed.

Girinka (One Cow Project)

Since 2015, 30 cows have been distributed and 6 additional ones have been given out through Passover. Leoncie, shown to the right, is one of the recipients of a cow, three goats, water tank, and shed. The cow has already given her two calves and she benefits from using the manure to plant her banana trees and vegetables and sells the milk. Leoncie was able to rehabilitate her home and is now able to pay for her two children's medical insurance, school fees, and is saving money to send her children to secondary school. Leoncie says that before her cows, she was just "a poor farmer" but now is comfortable supporting herself and children. Leoncie's husband had left her several years ago but she explains that because of the confidence she gained by being financially independent, her husband has come back and contributes to the family as well. Leoncie hopes to expand the number of cows she has in the future.

Three Goats Project



Nyirahabimana Oliva, a widowed mother of 8 children, with no source of income, lives on selling miaze, she is in 2nd categorie of UBUDEHE. She has no land and consequently she can't benefit from Girinka Program. The three goats program for families like mine is very important and addressing directly our income deficit "Oliva said". She believe since goats multiplies quickly she won't have problem to cover basics like health insurance, school materials for her children.



8 Water and Sanitation Project



Epiphany, Pelagie, and Francine (above, respectively) are women from Rilima who will benefit from the community water tank. Currently, all the women use the lake as their primary source of water. They have to send their children at least twice a day to the lake, and when they are in school, they have to go themselves. They have to constantly worry about the risks of drinking the water and frequently run out at night. If they do run out, they usually borrow water from neighbors because there can be crocodiles in the lake at night. They are excited to be able to save energy and have safer water to drink. Olivier and Denise, (bottom right picture, respectively) will also be able to spare their two trips to the lake daily and spend more time in school.



Fruit Trees



The fruit garden currently holds more than 16000 seedlings of avocados, oranges, and mangos. There will be enough to give 5,000 families three plants, include Josie, shown below. Josie is the president of the women's cooperative and is eager to receive her fruit trees. She will be adding it to her kitchen garden, which has been very prosperous. She hopes to sell fruit from her garden and work with the women in her cooperative to help each other maintain their



School Feeding Program



Vanessa and Estel (shown on the left, respectively) are beneficiaries of the school feeding program. Vanessa is the youngest in a family of five but has lived with her grandmother since her father's passing. Before the program, Vanessa would go home during the lunch hour but would come back to school without eating anything. The program has helped her a lot not only

physically, but she has also seen an improvement in her test scores and is now second in her class. Vanessa hopes to go to the university in the future to study business and has started a college savings account.

Estel also lives with her grandmother and would often go home to find no food. Now, she gets to benefit from eating at school and using her extra time to study during the lunch hour. She is now sixth in her class and wants to go to a university to study nursing or medicine.



Marcegaglia Scholarship for Girls



Terimber Valerie, 21 years, finished high school last year, 4th best of her class, She couldn't get school fees to continue for higher professional studies due to lack of financial means. Her Mother is sick of high blood pressure, father doesn't have a job and other six siblings lives on basic farming like most of people in Rilima. Starting in July, Valerie and other 7 girls dreams shall be realized through the Marcegaglia Girls scholarships program. She will be able to attend the Advanced Diploma Program in Akilah Institute Of Women, with a full scholarship, She dreams to become a Hotel manager and a good example for other girls in Rilima.



House for Widowed Women



Claudine (shown on the left) was chosen to have a new house constructed because of the dire need she had. Her husband passed away in 2010 and she was left on her own with her three kids. In her old

house, shown below, her and her kids often had to migrate within the house when it was raining because it had a dilapidated roof that leaked (picture bottom right). Claudine was part of the process to design and build her house and said that when her and her kids first stepped into the new house, it was “the most joyful time, we danced and sang!” Claudine is also a beneficiary of goats and participated in passover, giving away two of her goat offspring. She hopes to continue raising her kids and save enough money to pay for their school fees.

Another house was built for Mutamuliza Juliene, and Mukagatambiye Monique (not pictured) who are also a widow with four children each have been sheltered in very comfortable homes, fully furnished



Support for Women’s Cooperative



Leoncie and Gaudence (above, respectively) are both members of the women’s cooperatives. For the Imigongo painting cooperative, the women have already received orders from countries such as Italy and the United States. When they receive orders, they work long hours together, which brings them close to one another. The second cooperative focuses on the women who are beneficiaries of the different projects. Gaudence, who is the Vice President of the cooperatives, is responsible for guiding and looking out for the different beneficiaries. All of their projects involve everyone’s contribution, which has built a strong support group and gives them a sense of
